REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

The Sausalito-Marin City Sanitary District is requesting proposals for the prequalification of 1. general contractors and 2. electrical subcontractors for bidding on the construction of a treatment and wet weather flow upgrade project at its Wastewater Treatment Plant located at #1 East Road, Sausalito, California, 94965. Phone number 415-332-0244.

INTRODUCTION

The Sausalito-Marin City Sanitary District Treatment and Wet Weather Flow Upgrade project work under this contract will include furnishing all labor, materials and equipment including but not limited to; 1) demolition of select existing facilities; 2) civil/earthwork, including soil nail retaining walls, for a new access road and process structures; 3) yard and plant utility piping,including rerouting of the Main Street and Fort Baker influent sewers; 4) relocation of the existing 12kV electrical service and new switchgear; 5) new equalization storage tank and headworks structure, including all associated equipment; 6) new primary clarifier; 7) rehabilitation of the fixed film reactors, including new feed pumps, odor control covers, and media replacement; 8) new secondary polishing disk filters including filter feed pumps; and appurtenant work as needed to construct a complete and operational project as specified in these Contract Documents. The Work shall be performed in accordance with the intent of the Contract Documents, excluding any work under separate contract or other arrangement. The project Contractor is required to perform all civil, structural, mechanical, electrical and instrumentation work as applicable and as shown on the Drawings and required in the Specifications, to interconnect new equipment with existing equipment so as to provide completely functioning systems.

The project Contractor shall furnish all tools, equipment, apparatus, facilities, labor and material necessary to perform and complete in a good and workmanlike manner the construction of the TREATMENT AND WET WEATHER FLOW UPGRADE - PROJECT NO. 0055-006 as shown in the project technical specifications and plans and in accordance with the contract documents. The work includes but is not limited to; 1) demolition of select existing facilities; 2) civil/earthwork, including soil nail retaining walls, for a new access road and process structures; 3) yard and plant utility piping, including re-routing of the Main Street and Fort Baker influent sewers; 4) relocation of the existing 12kV electrical service and new switchgear; 5) new equalization storage tank and headworks structure, including all associated equipment; 6) new primary clarifier; 7) rehabilitation of the fixed film reactors, including new feed pumps, odor control covers, and media replacement; and 8) new secondary polishing disk filters including filter feed pumps and appurtenant work as needed to construct a complete and operational project as specified in the Contract Documents.

All work shall be completed within 730 calendar days of the project commencement date. Pursuant to California Public Contract Code Section 3300, a Class A California contractor's license is required to bid on the project. In accordance with California Business and Professions Code Section 7028.15, all project work must be performed by properly licensed contractors and subcontractors with active licenses in good standing as of the date and time specified for bid opening. Licenses must be issued by the Contractor's State License Board of California and must be maintained in good standing throughout the project term. In accordance with California Public Contract Code Section 6109, contractors and subcontractors who are ineligible to perform work on public works

projects pursuant to California Labor Code Sections 1777.1 or 1777.7 may neither bid on, be awarded or perform work as a subcontractor on the project.

The pre-qualification packages (questionnaire answers and financial statements) submitted by Contractors (general or electrical) are not public records and are not open to public inspection. All information provided will be kept confidential to the extent permitted by law. However, the contents may be disclosed to third parties for purpose of verification, or investigation of substantial allegations, or in the appeal hearing. State law requires that the names of contractors applying for pre-qualification status shall be public records subject to disclosure, and the first page of the questionnaire will be used for that purpose.

NOTICE INVITING PROPOSALS

- 1. Sausalito-Marin City Sanitary District is requesting proposals from general contractors and electrical subcontractors in order to pre-qualify the bidders for this unique construction project. Proposals shall be submitted to the Sausalito-Marin City Sanitary District located at #1 East Road, Sausalito, CA 94965, Attention: Kevin Rahman, PE, Project Manager by 2:00 pm, August 26, 2016. Submit two hard copies and one electronic copy on a CD of the proposal.
- 2. Complete answers to questions contained in the Application for Prequalification, information about current bonding capacity, an original notarized statement from an admitted, corporate surety, and the most recent reviewed or audited financial statements, with accompanying notes and supplemental information, are required. The District reserves the right to check other sources available. The District's decision will be based on objective evaluation criteria, as described in the prequalification packet. The District reserves the right to adjust, increase, limit, suspend, or rescind the prequalification rating based on subsequently learned information. Bidders whose rating changes sufficiently to disqualify them will be notified, and given the opportunity for a hearing consistent with the procedures described below for appealing a prequalification rating, provided there are at least 10 business days prior to the bid opening date to allow for the appeals hearing to be conducted.
- 3. While it is the intent of the Application for Prequalification and documents required therewith to assist the District in determining bidder responsibility prior to bid and to aid the District in selecting the lowest responsible bidder, neither the fact of pre-qualification, nor any prequalification rating, will preclude the District from a post-bid consideration and determination of whether a bidder has the quality, fitness, capacity and experience to satisfactorily perform the proposed work, and has demonstrated the requisite trustworthiness.
- 4. The work described requires that the general contractor be licensed by the State of California as a Class A Contractor and the electrical subcontractor as a C-10.

6. The estimated construction cost of this project is \$21M. This estimate is not based on a "contractor's cost take off" of the project, but is derived from an averaging of costs for work on similar projects of this type of which the District is aware. This figure is given to indicate the relative order of magnitude of this project and is not intended to influence or affect in any way the amount of the future bid for this project.

- 8. Addenda issued shall become a part of the documents furnished Contractors (general and electrical) for the preparation of proposals. Each proposal shall include specific acknowledgement in the space provided of receipt of all Addenda issued during the proposal period. Failure to so acknowledge may result in the proposal being rejected as not responsive. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to contact the District to determine the existence of any and all addenda.
- 9. Contractor shall be provide its Contractor's Registration Number from the State of California Department of Industrial Relations with its proposal. No contractor or subcontractor may be listed on a bid proposal for a public works project and no contractor or subcontractor may be awarded a contract for public work on a public works project unless registered with the Department of Industrial Relations pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5. The project for which this pre-qualification references will be subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations.
- 10. The right is reserved, as the interest of the District may require, to reject any or all proposals, to waive any informality in proposals, and to accept, modify, or reject any items of the proposal, or in the case of a single proposal being received to extend the acceptance date by up to thirty (30) days with notice.
- 11. When a timely and completed application results in a rating below that necessary to qualify, an appeal can be made. To initiate and appeal, Contractor must put in writing a notice to the District to appeal the decision with respect to its pre-qualification rating. The request must be made no later than the third business day following the Districts notification to the Contractor of his pre-qualification determination. Without a timely appeal, the Contractor waives all rights to challenge the decision of the District, whether by administrative process, judical process or any other legal process or proceeding.

If the Contractor gives the required and timely notice of appeal and requests a hearing, the hearing shall be conducted so that it is concluded within ten business days after the District's receipt of the notice of appeal. The hearing shall be an informal process conducted by a panel to which the District has delegated responsibility to hear such appeals. At or prior to the hearing, the Contractor will be advised of the basis for the Districts prequalification determination. The Contractor will be given th oppportunity to present information and present reasons in opposition to the rating. The Appeals Panel will render its decision within two business days after the conclusion of the hearing.

Note: A Contractor (general or electrical) may be found not prequalified for the following reasons:

- a. Omission of requested information.
- b. Information not meeting specific performance critieria.
- c. Falsification of information.
- d. Failure to provide updated material or corrected information.
